## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Welcome to some light reading highlighting some very memorable and some not so memorable moments of Season 2024-25!!

I begin with the sad passing of two great members of BCC in Robert "Bob" Croft in June 2024 and Bernie "Gubby" Allen in October 2024. These two Life Members and Legends both passed away peacefully but would have been extremely proud of the success achieved by the Club this season. Vale Bob and Gubby.

We again fielded five Senior Mens Sides, a Senior Womens Side, two Super 7s, one Fast 9s, two Girls, one U12, two U14 and one U16 teams together with four T20 sides including one with RDCA and also a mixed team of mothers, daughters, dads and daughters and partners (which was a great success) and a T15 team aimed at our U17s in a trial run for next season, playing across three Associations and on three home Grounds. And continued to run the Woolies Blasters program.

We also hosted VMCU Junior Rep Carnival matches over two weeks in January, but missed out on hosting the Ray McIntosh Grand Final. However, we may have the opportunity to do so this coming Season!

We recruited well in the off Season and welcomed Shehan (Shaz) Kudage Don and Gourav (George) Sukhija from Vermont. While George missed a few games due to family matters and Shaz missed many weeks due to a shocking finger injury to his finger, their commitment to BCC was unwavering and it showed in their valuable finals performances!!

The Season started off with the obligatory first day of play wash out and the most extraordinary fixture for our 1st and 2nd XIs. Rounds 4 through to 9 saw the Ones fixtured

away which in turn had the Twos at home all that time. It was less than ideal and, in some ways, tended to alienate the away teams from the Club. A and D Grade also had byes and I Grade played at Ballyshannessy but managed to play two home matches at Morton Park due to the byes in the higher grades after we applied to have the games moved.

More detail can be found below as to how each team fared through the Season, but how proud was I and the Club to have five of our six senior teams including our Women's team (again) reach the Semi Finals. In the Juniors, only our U12s made it to a Grand Final this season and didn't come home with the chocolates, but certainly gave it their all.

So out of these achievements, we managed a Ray McIntosh Premiership and an A Grade Premiership. And what a celebration was had. It's been 10 years since the last 1st XI flag and 28 years since the last 3rd XI Flag. In our 123-year history we have achieved eleven first grade flags and twelve 1st XI Premierships – the twelfth being the only season Blackburn has not played in the "top flight" when the Club underestimated its playing strength in 1938-39 and asked to be demoted, only to turn around and win the flag. Along with those Premierships that also means our 1st XI has never been relegated from the highest grade. And that's an achievement also worth celebrating!!

Congratulations to both Teams. You put in the hard work and were well rewarded for it. You dared to dream and you made that dream a reality together creating fantastic memories and life-long friendships and instilling a great sense of pride for the Club and its members and supporters. Well done.



Congratulations also to Luke Davis on receiving the Trevor Hutchins Medal, RMS Batting Award, Conor Spinks Mark Jones Medal RMS Bowling Award, Max Rimmer for coming Runner Up in the Len Toogood Award the RMS Best and Fairest Award and receiving the Frank Horne Medal as the best player in the RMS Grand Final, Shehan Kudage Dom for coming Runner Up in the RMS Batting Award) and Colin McKenzie for his Runner Up in the A Grade Batting Award.

us staying in a strong position as a club moving forward.

- Senior Womens team making the Semi Final. Huge effort and great to see the team growing and being part of the club more and more every year.

### **Team Development and Training**

This season, we focused on enhancing our team's skills through training sessions and strategic planning. There was a large focus on club culture and future proofing our club to be the best version of itself it can be for a sustained period.

- We were able to expose some of our younger players to 1st XI cricket. Noah and Darcy both made their 1st XI debuts. Jacob Whitehead played 8 games and was 12th man in our premiership. Tom Audley who is still only 20 played a pivotal role in the 1st XI including an unbelievable GF performance.
- Fielding drills to sharpen reflexes and coordination, leading to fewer dropped catches and misfields.
- We tried to incorporate a junior/senior mentor program. This needs more attention and time dedicated to it, but it is vital moving forward.
- We would often include some of our juniors in our 1st and 2nd XI training session on the top oval on a Thursday night to expose them to the level of cricket required and be more inclusive.

### **Challenges Faced**

Despite our successes, we encountered several challenges:

- Injuries and availability: players suffered injuries at crucial times, impacting team performance as well as player unavailability.
- The 4th XI fixture proved hard to get any continuity.

- The 2nd XI would often be the team that would suffer from selection and availability. Whenever the 1st XI had an injury/unavailability, it would be the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI that would suffer and playing in the 3rd top grade this proved hard at times.

### **Future Prospects**

Looking ahead, the Blackburn Cricket Club is poised for continued success. Our goals for the upcoming season should include:

- Strengthening our squad by recruiting talented players and nurturing young prospects.
- Enhancing our training programs with advanced techniques and equipment.
- Fostering team spirit and camaraderie through team-building activities and community engagements such as the junior mentor program
- Setting higher performance targets to challenge our players and achieve greater milestones.
- More Shield grade opportunities for junior prospects.
- A big watch on the future generation including Harry, Dan, and Jimmy Geason, Ollie Crossland, Noah De Leo, Tom and Sam Whelan, Lachie Hong, Andrew Phillips, Jack Larsen, Jordan Shade, Coby Verhayen, Oliver Whitmee, Cooper Byrnes, Campbell Froese, Jack Harman, Darcy Rowland and many more.

## **WOMEN'S COACH'S REPORT**

For season 24/25 the Blackburn women had 16 players (down from 23) play with a core group of 12 who played most weeks. This is our third year with a women's team and numbers are trending down. Lisa Agnew again captained and has improved her batting to the extent I expect she will have a big year next year!

This season was mostly positive with the women finishing on 6 wins (10 last year) and 6 losses (7 last year) from 16 games with 4 games abandoned.

Our final game this season was a semi-final loss to Wandin who passed our score of 139 with 3 overs to spare. Best bat was Alyssa Rowe with 55\* and best bowlers were Sophie Agnew and Mia Holland both with 2 wickets.

There were several notable performances throughout the year: Our star player, Alyssa Rowe topped the RDCA C grade aggregate with 409 runs and, although her bowling was restricted due to a back injury after Christmas, her 5 wickets contributed to her being awarded the RDCA Best Player in C Grade and of course the our Club Women's Champion. Alyssa is going on to play premier cricket next season and we wish her well.

Bella Fox scored 212 runs and took out the club batting at an average of 70 runs with 5 not outs being dismissed only three times. Belinda Barnard with 262 and Lisa Agnew with 175 also had stellar batting years.

Bowling wise Mia Holland was the big improver with 5 wickets and excellent accuracy. The Club bowling award winner was Sophie who at 12 years old, amazingly took 10 wickets including the star bats from Wandin in all games – simply amazing.

From a cricket skill perspective, our bowling is the skill that needs the most improvement – most bowlers struggle to find a consistent line and length.

Because of the limited number of girls and women's that are playing cricket in our area, we've got a wide range of ages and it's worth calling out that it's a huge achievement for the second year running to have several juniors: Sophie Agnew, Emily Agnew and Emily Crossland step up and play women's cricket. We also had a few girls from other junior clubs try out senior cricket for a match or two; with luck they will return next year.

Our partnership with Box Hill did not result in any games played by Box Hill players.

Things to watch: Some of the girls in-between who have finished juniors in the last two years did struggle and we will need to look very closely at the benefits of being competitive and seeking to win games against the opportunity to bat and bowl as a developing player and be confident to do so in games where it may impact the result. Given the drop-off of players in this category, this should be looked at - more wins can't be judged as an overall success measure if some girls who haven't had as much opportunity to develop their skills decide not to pursue cricket in subsequent seasons.

Next season we will need to recruit 2-4 players, or we may not field a side – the Committee may approach similar placed clubs to run a combined side.

I'd like to thank Jo Bowler and the rest of the Committee for all the hard work that they do to run this wonderful club. I'm looking forward to next season and a fantastic year for women's cricket.

## ***First Eleven (Ray McIntosh Shield)***

### ***A Historic Season for the Burners***

The 2024/25 season will go down as one of the most memorable in the proud history of Blackburn Cricket Club, as the 1st XI claimed our first McIntosh Shield premiership in ten years. After a decade of hard work, rebuilding, and near-misses, this season marked the culmination of persistence, talent, and a strong club culture.

### ***Season Highlights***

#### **McIntosh Shield Premiers**

The 1st XI brought home the silverware after a dominant finals campaign, capped by a spirited grand final victory that showcased both individual brilliance and team unity. From tight bowling spells to game-winning partnerships with the bat, every player had a role to play in this long-awaited success.

#### **Regular Season Performance**

Blackburn finished the home-and-away season in 2nd place, securing a home final and riding a wave of momentum into the postseason.

After a sluggish start to the season we were able to get back on track in round 3 after a comfortable 103 run win over Vermont Sth at home backed up in round 5 with another strong 9 wicket win over Mitcham on the Saturday and hard fought 4 wicket win over Kerrimuir on the Sunday.

We rode this momentum until a little hiccup in the last round before Christmas when we had a shocker in the field and with the ball and lost to Vermont South after making 261 with the bat. It proved to be the making of us as we didn't lose another game for the remainder of the season.

This season ended the way it did with a Premiership because we were the best team. We were the best team not only on

field but off it. Such a close and caring group who often put the team's best interests ahead of their own. Playing a role was something we spoke about a lot and no doubt this was challenging at times but having the Shield sitting on our wall at Morton Park showed the strength in doing what we did.

The group is full of leaders which makes my job so much easier. Mitch and Nic were both unbelievable throughout the week assisting in training sessions and match days, and having a club great and previous captain/coach in Luke is an asset I will forever be thankful for.

Conor has matured as a cricketer on the field, as shown by his performance but also as an individual and leader.

Tom and Max were the hardest workers and I am so proud of the way the season panned out for both of them with Max seeing great results in keeping and batting and Tom showing post Xmas what an asset he is for BCC taking over 20 wickets in the last 6 games.

Shehan and George were such terrific people to come into the club and perform the way they did. Unfortunately Shaz missed a chunk of time with injury but was still able to manage over 400 runs with George making over 300 including a century and 50\* in a GF.

Dylan showed tremendous maturity coming into the team and playing an important role with the ball taking big wickets and breakthroughs for us.

To have Tom Audley come back this year was a blessing and we couldn't be more thankful. His talent in all disciplines is something others are very envious of - a big future ahead at the club for many years to come.

- Round 2 v. Koonung Heights – Luke Davis 93\* in a losing side.

- Round 3 v Vermont Sth – The Shaz and Max show – Shaz made his first ton for BCC with 106 and Max 97\* in a 212 run opening stand.
- Round 5 v Mitcham – a 120 run opening stand between Shaz and Max.
- Round 7 v Koonung Heights – Tom Audley – unreal bowling display, unplayable at times culminating in a 5 fa including a hat trick which will be replayed for years to come.
- Round 8 v Forest Hill – Nic Chancellor 91 off 66 balls to rip the game away from the opposition.
- Round 10 v Box Hill Nth – Huge team effort. Gave us belief moving forward.
- Round 11 v Glen Waverley – George making his first ton for BCC even with a calf strain finishing on 114 off 112 balls.
- Round 13 v Mitcham – 130 run partnership between Conor and Darcy on his debut, including Darcy making 50\*.
- Round 14 v Kerrimuir – Luke Davis 150\* in a dominant performance.
- Semi Final v Kerrimuir – Clinical performance from the team giving us a Grand Final berth.
- Grand Final v Box Hill North – Max took 6 catches in a Man of the Match performance; Luke's 3 wicket over; Tom Audley 4 fa and 15 not out; and George 50\*.

### Thanks

The premiership was a reward not just for the 1st XI but for the entire club—coaches, junior programs, volunteers, and supporters. The depth of talent, particularly with several under 30 year old players contributing at senior level, bodes well for sustained success in the coming years.

This season also saw a renewed focus on fitness, fielding standards, and mental resilience—foundations that turned tight contests into wins.

Thanks to the playing group – it will be a season I will never forget and something we can celebrate together forever. Premiership reunions are very special and we will have this to look forward to.



## Women's 1st XI

We started the season with some concerns around our grading and our numbers. From an association stand point it was understandable to keep us in C grade after being runners up in the previous season, but we had lost players and were seriously short of numbers.

We filled a team for round 1 with 3 juniors. Little did we know that they would go from being fill-ins, to a part of our main team for the remainder of the season. Without these three, Emily Agnew, Sophie Agnew and Emily Crossland, we would not have fielded a team for most rounds.

There is no avoiding talking about our first round game. A T20 against Bayswater Park. Our bowling and fielding was rusty, but given our training and inexperience, was as expected. The real shock was our batting. All out for 38, 23 of which were extras. Emily Crossland our top scorer of 5. We certainly went away licking our wounds, wondering what the rest of the season would bring in C grade.

Round 2 – another T20, but we found our groove. A great knock from Belinda Barnard gave us a decent total to defend. Our fielding was on point, with 4 run outs and a catch. And we only fielded with 9 players. We were starting to remember how to play cricket!

Round 3 – we faced our nemesis from last season, North Ringwood. This was meant to be a 36 over game. After some discussion with their captains, we agreed the RDCA's decision to change C grade to 36 overs without consultation was ordinary, so we shook on playing 30 overs. Again with outstanding batting from Belinda and Bella Fox to open the innings, we made a competitive total of 210. We didn't get many

wickets, and again fielding with only 9, but managed to keep North Ringwood to 191.

Between rounds 3 and 4, the RDCA reviewed the grading. We put forward an email requesting a change to D grade to play 30 over matches, or changing C grade back to 30 overs. Realistically, we were only hoping for the over reduction. The RDCA put it to a vote with the C grade teams, and it was decided to return to the 30 over format.

We took away a convincing win to Chirnside in round 4 again with 9 players. We headed into a T20 in round 5 against Kilsyth with a full 11 and were full of confidence. We waited for the rain to stop and got in a full game. We were the only team in the comp to get a game in. After great confusion as to whether the game would count, it did. No 50% rule in the RDCA as it turns out. Unfortunately we lost this game.

We won the remaining games in the lead up to Christmas, including against the top team, Wandin. So, leading into the Christmas break we were on top of the ladder.

Unfortunately, that was the high point of the season for us. We didn't win another game for the year. We had a series of heat outs or wash outs that contributed to this, but overall, we didn't bowl well. Our batting was just holding together, but we didn't make big enough totals to defend.

We made the semi-final, but possibly only due to a round cancelled due to fire risk. We played Wandin at their home. And while it was an extremely close game in the end, we couldn't take the win.

The highlight of the season has been watching Alyssa Rowe significantly improve her batting. While she didn't quite make a century in any match, she went close. If we played the 36 overs, she probably would

have! Her fielding and energy in the field is something we should all be aspiring to. Unfortunately, her back injury prevented her bowling in the last games of the season and while she didn't take as many wickets as she should have, her dot balls were "off the charts". Alyssa will be one to watch in the future. She also took out the champion player for C grade at the RDCA presentation night. Bella batted very well and quickly. Belinda took on opening the batting every week and despite having a short-lived form slump, kept up a great attitude and continued to do a job that the rest of us didn't feel capable of.

Bowling is an area we needed to improve on from our previous season. Jo Fox and Belinda Barnard certainly worked hard and started to consistently land the ball offside, and wickets followed. Mia Holland drastically improved her bowling and her interest in cricket, taking the time to learn how to score using the book. Emily Agnew, started to get more consistency in her bowling, and took a few vital wickets, but was also very challenging to score off. Finally, the big surprise was Sophie Agnew, taking the most wickets for our team and being our youngest player. Starting the season at age 10. Nick-named "the Destroyer" by Luke Gibson, she confused batters from all teams. She managed to get into the head of the captain of Wandin, getting her out 3 times. As her captain and mum, I have been very proud of her achievements this season. placed the ball where we asked her to, and the catches followed. I didn't think I would be calling on my children and Emily Crossland to make up a team this season, but we were lucky we had them. These three kids have been resilient, playing their own cricket in the mornings, and then playing women's in the afternoon.

Our next season is already looking challenging. We are losing more players,

and we don't have too many more juniors we can drag up to fill a team although I do have my eye on a couple! We are going to need to branch out and possibly approach other clubs in a similar position to form a team. Our affiliation with Box Hill CC didn't bring any players this season. They have changed structure and our alliance has weakened.

To Jo and the Committee, we felt increased support this season and we are truly grateful. We need to work hard to integrate the women's team into the club and its culture. It would be great to start thinking about it as "the senior playing group" and less about women's and men's. Hopefully we can work together to attract more players in coming seasons and further grow out women's side.

I would like to thank Rob Willis for his coaching and support throughout the season. We have given him a few more grey hairs, and he has to stay indoors while we field so we can't hear what he thinks, but he is always there to help us! Rob has done a great job, getting the women's team up and running, but he needs help. I feel confident in saying he would like to not coach us again and to find someone else to fill the role. Sitting back and enjoying his daughter play cricket and helping out with the odd job is where he should find himself next season. Finding a new women's coach would certainly be a starting point to building our future.

Thanks to Colin McKenzie, who comes to support his partner Belinda, but scores, umpires or offers me captaincy help. His knowledge of the game is invaluable. Thanks to Mick, Ollie and Amanda Crossland who have helped where they can with scoring and afternoon tea preparation. Briella Humphreys-Crouch has filled in for us, come down to support and even substitute-fielded in the final. She is wonderful to have around the club and provides an energy that has guided us to some great moments, including Alyssa's 86 from 90 balls. Lastly, a

big thank you to James Agnew. He trains with the girls every week, bowling hundreds of balls to make sure we get a good go in the nets, for supporting me and running my business so I can leave it to play on a Sunday. If James wasn't behind the scenes, I would not be able to captain the Women's 1st XI.

## **Junior Section**

### **Blackburn Junior Cricket Teams**

In Season 2024/5, we had 10 Junior Team representing Blackburn Cricket Club in the competitive age groups, with involvement in 3 additional short form teams (T20 and T15s), playing on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday evenings and Sunday mornings. (See table below)

#### **Team Set Up**

Our Age Level Coordinators Kal Peiris, Mike Billing and Ben Stone worked very hard to set up our teams for 2024/25. We had a lot of returning players which made organising players into the appropriate standard somewhat easier. Friday night and Sunday morning continue to be the most popular playing times for Blackburn families. This focuses our teams into the Box Hill Reporter District Association (BHRDCA). There is strong interest from Ringwood District Cricket Association (RDCA) for Blackburn teams to enter their competitions; however, our families prefer to minimise travel and prefer BHRDCA. We also have very limited interest in Saturday morning cricket, reducing the number of teams available to play in RDCA competitions.

The challenge to get the right number of players to fill complete teams remains, as having too many players for one team but not enough for two was felt in the older age groups. Being able to open up Play HQ registrations earlier for Season 2025/26 may be a way to manage these challenges in the future.

We continue to work with the Associations to get the gradings as close to right for our teams, but as usual, it depends on other clubs putting their teams in the right grade. With only 2-3 levels available in the BHRDCA Competition, there is limited range.

The arrival of a new competition manager in Cricket Victoria for BHRDCA was new for the

Junior competition and resulted in some delays in the season set up. We made two applications and were able to obtain one permit for a player to play over age in the U14s competition, which is very limited in BHRDCA.

With our mix of teams and days and times played, we were able to have all teams play their home matches at Morton Park. Ground allocations on Friday evenings were more manageable as they were all part of the BHRDCA, but were more challenging on Sunday mornings due to sharing the ground across BHRDCA (Fast 9s) and Stage 2 Girls (RDCA). Communication for ground allocations across the Associations was challenging and distribution of home games between the two teams was not even.

All our teams had a positive season, growing and improving in skills, game awareness and match understanding. Our U12s team made the Semi-finals and played well against a strong Glen Waverley team. The team were positive and played well in challenging conditions in their final.

#### **Grading and Regrading**

Our Stage 2 Girls team was regraded early in the season into a level beyond their current capacity. They handled the challenge well and learned a lot about Cricket playing against more experienced teams. Given the current experience of our current Stage 2 teams, they will be more appropriately graded to ensure their skills are more evenly matched with opposition teams. Our U14s (1) Team was approached to be regraded to the higher level, which we rejected and our team continued to play in the most appropriate competition for the team.

Special thanks go to our Age Group Coordinators, Team Coaches and Team Managers who have supported all our teams to learn, grow and play throughout Season 2024/25.


