## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I would first like to acknowledge the passing this season of three giants of our Club upon whose shoulders we are privileged to stand.

Ron "Geeza" Eade passed away in March 2023. Age got the better of him and he passed away peacefully with his family at his side. I have fond memories of chats with Geeza on Thursday nights at the bar in the old clubrooms. He was a cheeky devil and always with a story to tell or a joke. We last saw him at the Club for Life Members lunch and although his mobility was restricted, he enjoyed the day very much! I've caught up with his daughter Cheryl a couple of times since and she found the following "D" grade premiership photo from 1957-58 which she has given to BCC. Thanks for the memories, Geeza!



We also lost another great Club member in Russell Punton earlier in the season. I didn't know Russell that well, but understand from those that did that he was a quiet "big achiever" – the wicket-keeper in our illustrious Team of the Century announced in the Club's centenary season 2002-2003, Treasurer for over two decades and a committed club member, who for years regularly cleaned the old rooms often on his own on a Sunday morning. Fittingly, Russell's wake was held in the clubrooms with many past players joining with his family to celebrate his life including his outstanding contribution to our Club.

After the season ended, we were deeply saddened to hear that John Cotter had lost his prolonged battle with ill-health. A born leader, passionate Blackburn person and revered elder statesman at our Club, John played for over thirty years and led the 3<sup>rd</sup> XI to two flags, played in another one and also a 5<sup>th</sup> XI Premiership late in his career. Among his individual honours, John won the 3<sup>rd</sup> XI batting averages five times and most serviceable award twice. Unsurprisingly, the medal for the best player in 3<sup>rd</sup> XI finals is named in his honour. Off the field his contribution was no less enormous serving on the Committee for many years including four as Treasurer and another four as President. On the sad news of Cotts' passing, former President Jeremy Beard, captured him beautifully saying "John was a wonderful person, great clubman and excellent captain."

May all three of these legends rest in peace.

What a fantastic Season 2022-23 became with the Club winning 5 Flags!! With little or no Covid 19 to be seen, we were hopeful of a "normal" season. Mother Nature again had other plans.

With the loss of the top oval for the season due to a complete rebuild, our Junior and Senior Teams were spread across 5 home grounds, playing Tuesdays, Wednesday and Friday nights, Saturdays and Sundays with training spread over almost every night at two and sometimes three different venues, playing different formats of the game and involving three associations. We also had the wettest start to a season that I can

remember for quite some time and the poor West oval, which had taken a battering from the Football season and the wet weather, was unplayable and actually closed by Whitehorse City Council. It had only just started to recover mid February and still had some dead patches at handover to Blackburn Football Club.

With all the weather delays to the start of the season, we agreed not to start the Woolies Blasters till quite late in the season which led to quite low numbers. This was also reflected in our Super 7's and Fast 9's numbers, of which we only had one Fast 9's team in the end. Our other Junior teams fared quite well and in total we fielded 13 Teams. We moved our three Under 12 Friday teams to Ringwood and District Cricket Association, (RDCA) which proved to be a good move. The U12-8 team only lost one game and ended up Premiers together with the U14B Friday and Stage 2 Girls Teams. Next season may see BCC revert back to an Under 10 style competition for that age group through the RDCA instead of the Super 7s and Fast 9s format. Further details for the Junior Season can be found later in this Report.

Of course, the Junior program could not have proceeded without the determination of our Age Group Coordinators being Anthony Hoye (U12), Ben Stone (U14), Amanda Geason (U16), Steve Dick (Fast 9s), the wonderful crew of girls who took over the Woolies Blasters in Bella, Katie, Abbey, Isabel and Alana, and Luke Gibson and Adrian Fox (Girls teams). Thank you for all your efforts in what was a difficult start to the Season.

We also fielded our first Womens Team who made it to the Grand Final only to lose by a mere 2 runs - a fantastic effort in their first season. Thank you to Adrian for making the team possible and to Rob Willis for coaching. Their competition was run through the Eastern Cricket Association (ECA) and will most likely move to the RDCA next season. Exciting times for Blackburn.

We again fielded 5 Senior men's teams - Ray McIntosh, Peter White and Grades B, D and G. Four sides made the Semi Finals with the D grade team just missing out. Unfortunately, the 1st XI bowed out in the Semi Finals to Box Hill North Superkings, who went on to win the Grand Final

very convincingly (along with three other Senior flags) and the 3rd and 5th XIs, which both suffered batting collapses in their Semis. The 2nd XI, however, won their way through the Grand Final and smashed their opponents to achieve a comfortable win. I think they are still celebrating!! I must say I was extremely proud of the boys in bringing home the Peter White Shield. Having known and dealt with Peter over the years, I always found him to be very helpful and supportive and he is still greatly missed.

BCC, under the leadership of Mitch Gale (President's Award Recipient), also won a T20 flag. Although the boys looked upon the T20 as extra game time and a bit more of a social event than a game of cricket, they played some really great cricket against some strong opponents.

So I'd like to thank our Senior Captains this season being Jordy Wise, Mitch Gale, James Gardner-Drummond, Rob Willis, Sam Franklin, Luke Gibson, Ben Sandells, Nick de Preu, Lachlan Fox, Simon Nelson and Warren Roberts. Some captained for the whole season, some for only a couple of games but you all contributed to our success at Blackburn. It must also be acknowledged that the Grade B, D and G teams were all assigned to higher Grades than we had applied for; but it proved that the teams had the ability and talent to do well at those higher levels. Congratulations also to our Juniors playing Senior cricket. They have all achieved outstanding results and contributed to the strong position that we are now in.



With the number of graduating Juniors from this season, coupled with a couple of dads who wish to play with their sons and maybe daughters, there could be a sixth Senior side on the horizon!! Season 2023-24 is looking very exciting.

Thank you to all our Committee members including our Age Group Coordinators mentioned above and Julie Gibson, Simon Nelson, Neil Robertson, Michael Long, Steve Franklin and Briella Humphries-Crouch. A special mention of Judge who received a 50 year Volunteer Award for his (actual 54 years) outstanding contribution to our Club from Cricket Victoria at a lunch during the Boxing Day Test – fantastic recognition for a fantastic BCC person, who continues to put in passionately as our Director of Cricket and Chair of Selectors. Massive thank you to Club Coach, Jack Hamilton for the work he has put in this season whilst dealing with his own major injury. Thank you also to Darren Croft for his wisdom and guidance that he gives to the senior cohort, in particular the 1st XI, who are extremely grateful for his input. He is such a well-respected and integral part of Blackburn and the wider cricketing community. Without the work that you all do and your commitment to Blackburn, the support given to me, the Club would not exist.

We welcome new Life Members Luke Davis and Adrian Fox. Such deserving recipients. Congratulations to Andrew Steele and Simon Nelson on your 20 Year Player Awards. Both outstanding People and Cricketers! Congratulations to all our Award winners both within the club and from BHRDCA. Another great achievement by Luke Davis on winning the Len Toogood Award again this Season.

Special thanks to Peter “Turk” Turnley for not only coaching an U16 team and cooking meals on most Thursday nights but also for his unwavering support of me and words of wisdom. You are a Legend. Thanks also to Ronan Johnson, Jacob Whitehead and Tom Shanley for coaching the U16s.

So as the “flags” fall on yet another Season, a Season that didn’t go exactly to plan on a number of fronts, but nevertheless was a great Season, I am so proud to be associated with Blackburn Cricket Club. I have made many friends, some enemies, watched kids grow into respectful young adults and witnessed the highs and lows of wins and losses but the one thing that stands out is the community spirit that is Blackburn Cricket Club. The “looking out for each other”, supportive and positive attitude from all is what makes our Club so great and so well respected by others.

## **COACH'S REPORT**

Season 22/23 was a terrific season that saw the club again grow and take steps forward. Our Ones and Twos remained in the grades they played in for 2021/22 in Ray Mcintosh and Peter White shield grades while our lower grades all moved up - our Threes up two grades from D to B, the Fourths up three grades from G to D, and our 5th XI up 2 grades from I to G. Four senior sides making finals is an incredible achievement and, with so many young players taking part in senior cricket, it puts the longevity of the club in a terrific place.

A small group of us started pre-season on Monday Nights at Topline all the way back at the start of July 2022, with the rest of the group joining us on Sunday evenings from the first Sunday in August. Seven Sunday sessions, a practice match against Montrose and before you knew it the cricket season rolled around at the beginning of October. Unfortunately, the weather had other ideas meaning we had one playing day from the first four rounds of cricket. The playing group, to their credit through frustration, stuck fat with Tuesday and Thursday trainings getting record numbers in my time at the club and finally the reward came with cricket being able to get on the park. By Christmas the club had all sides in a position to play finals which was an exciting change especially in the higher grades where hard work at training had meant we weren't chasing the pack and instead were able put ourselves in a position of strength.

The 1st XI had a few hiccups along the way but finished the season in 3rd place with a terrific win over Heatherdale in the final round of the home and away season. Unfortunately they lost to the eventual Premiers in a semi-final the following weekend.

Our 2nd XI led the way all year, I couldn't be prouder of this young group with the growth, hunger, and enjoyment of playing cricket they showed week in week out and a premiership by blowing Yarraleen off the bottom oval at Morton Park was a deserving reward.

Our 3rd XI finished in 4th place and gave the Glen Waverley Cougars a red-hot crack in the semi-final. Our 4th XI just missed out on finals with some disappointing results in the final games. While our 5th XI backing up from last season's Premiership made it to a semi final losing to Deakin's 2nd XI.

From a coaching perspective setting our young cricketers up with standards at training to allow them to develop, and good strong leaders helping to guide them across Tuesday, Thursday and Saturdays was a critical target for this season. Our captains of Jordan Wise / Mitch Gale, James Gardner-Drummond, Sam Franklin / Rob Willis, Luke Gibson and Warren Roberts / Simon Nelson have all been terrific at different stages throughout the season and the ability to create an environment where people keep coming back is a credit to you all as leaders.

Personally, doing my ACL in the 1st game back after Christmas wasn't the plan I had for my season and going from a playing coach to non-playing presented new challenges that forced me to learn as the season progressed. A massive thank you goes out to Mitch Gale, Ronan Johnson, Luke Gibson and Mitch Rowe for running training at stages where I couldn't after Christmas. And to those members of our great club that supported me through a period of time that hasn't been easy.

Another special mention needs to go to Mitch Rowe, who took on the role of fielding coach at just 19 years old.

I truly believe this club is in the strongest position it has been in years. This reflects the hard work of our Committee, the buy in of our playing group, and the great people that call Blackburn Cricket Club home.

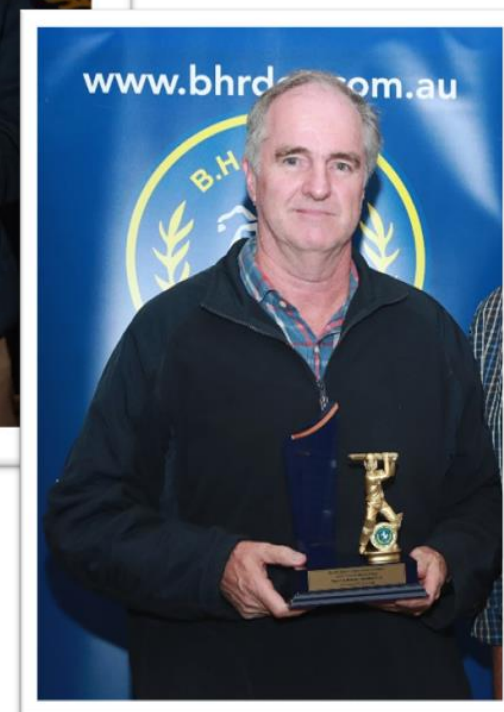

## ***Inter Club Trophies***

### ***Frank Horne Memorial Trophy***

Since the 1997-98 season, Blackburn and East Burwood-Bennettswood's (now known as East Burwood) annual Ray McIntosh Shield fixture has been played for this trophy struck to honour the memory of Frank Horne.

Frank is a legend at East Burwood-Bennettswood and throughout the Association. Besides being a champion cricketer, Frank was also a champion bloke and a great friend of many at Blackburn, who sadly died in 1997 aged 37.

With an eight team Ray McIntosh Shield grade, each team, weather permitting, is supposed to play the other teams twice each season – once in a one-day match and once in a two-day game.

This season it was Blackburn's turn to host this match. The Clubs agreed the first clash of the season in Round 7 at Ballyshannassy Park South (as Morton Park East was unavailable and West unfit for play) would be played for the Franke Horne Trophy. We reclaimed it.

### ***Blackburn 7/192 cc def East Burwood 173.***

In our second encounter, the two-day match at East Burwood in the following round, we also claimed the points: Blackburn 170 def East Burwood 153.

### ***Colin James Memorial Shield***

Another traditional annual clash is between the highest graded senior Nunawading and Blackburn teams for the Colin James Shield.

Colin was a long serving player at Nunawading, who was respected by all in the Box Hill Reporter CA community. He was only 48 when he died of a massive heart attack in the Nunawading social rooms in 1995. Both clubs agreed that the best way to remember Colin was a trophy decided by the result of the annual Ray McIntosh Shield match. With Nunawading's relegation, the Colin James Shield is now contested by the clubs' teams in the highest grade they meet.

This season that clash was between our 2<sup>nd</sup> XI and Nunawading's 1<sup>st</sup> XI in the Round 13 Peter White Shield clash with our boys retaining the Shield.

## ***First Eleven (Ray McIntosh Shield)***

Once again, we started the year with some uncertainty around the fixture and grounds and weather, but we headed into it full of excitement based on our off season and pre-season.

After losing the semi-final in season 21/22 we knew exactly what we needed to acquire to make us a better team on field and we went after that via some cagey recruitment through some of our current 1st XI players. We were able to acquire two opening bowlers and a young wicket keeper/bat. Conor, Tom and Max fit perfectly into the Blackburn culture and got to work hardly missing a session through the pre-season and regular season. We couldn't have been happier with what we got out of the new boys.

Playing away from our home base was a challenge early in the year but one that we embraced. We started well in winning our first game against Vermont Sth who were finalists last year. After bowling well we got into early trouble at 4/20 but were able to consolidate and win the game compiling 4/154 with Mitch Gale continuing his great form finishing 90 no and combining with myself in an unbeaten 130 run partnership.

Back-to-back wash outs saw us not play again until Round 5 where Heatherdale got the better of us even though there were some positive signs for us, specifically Matt Stella making 50 opening the batting.

The next Round saw us come up against last year's Grand Finalists in Box Hill North - a massive challenge and probably our best win of the year. After giving up 245 with the ball, we needed an even contribution from our batting line up and that is exactly what we got led once again by Mitch Gale with 72 and some great late order hitting by Rohj and Cran to get us over the line and give us belief

that we were right in the hunt this year after beating two of the previous season's finalists.

Back-to-back wins against East Burwood saw us in a really good position with Mitch Gale again doing the job with the bat and saw Luke Davis also finding some form again with a 50 at the top of the order. Tom Rimmer took a bag of 4 wickets and Conor a "Michelle" in the 2nd match which meant we were really starting to click in all aspects of our game.

Playing ladder leaders Vermont in the last game before Xmas was always going to be a test and we were below par in this game and the experience of Vermont shone through with Taylor and Mascarenhas teaching us a lesson in two-day batting. We needed to get to work on our 80 over batting so a good lesson for us.

In the first game back after Xmas Luke showed his absolute class in carrying his bat in an unbeaten 100 which saw us post a very competitive score against Vermont only to be chased down with 8 balls to go – very disappointing especially after a strong batting performance.

Facing the bottom of the ladder Forest Hill back at Morton Park gave us a really good opportunity to put in a strong performance, this game had extra meaning for us after a tragic week off field. We came together and were determined to put in a good performance for all involved. We did just that with Luke once again showing his class with 77 not out. Tom Rimmer again the pick of the bowlers with another "4fa".

The last few games were again a roller coaster. In the previous years we had been on the verge of relegation battles and dealing



with the emotion of that, then fighting so hard to scrap into finals. This year was again the case of needing wins to make finals, we had played well enough and, in my opinion, deserved to be there but there was still work to do. We were also dealing with injuries and disruptions to our batting order. Mitch Gale was leading the way filling in as skipper and doing a wonderful job.

We had a tough loss to Vermont South putting us on the back foot and needing to win the last two games of the season. East Box Hill at Morton Park was an absolute cracker, both teams struggled with the bat as we were bowled out for 113 then to fight back with some quality tight bowling from all of our bowlers. Luke had come back to the bowling crease in the second half of the year and took "4fa" with Tommy taking three and dismissing them for 81 setting us up for a last round showdown against Heatherdale at Heatherdale.

Needing a win to make finals due to some dodgy happenings around the grounds the boys dug deep with the ball and the game had massive swings in momentum. We were able to bowl them out for 179 from 77 overs. Luke again starred taking "5 fa" but the bowling group worked really well together with Conor again doing damage at the top taking both openers and bowling as economically as ever and Tom able to do enough to secure the competition bowling award.

The chase was a nailbiter. Nic was sensational, unselfish and solid as ever leading the batting with 40 off 105 balls. This was the foundation we needed with Mitch and Nic coming together for a 90-run partnership and we knocked off the total 8 wickets down.

The semi final saw us come up against the Superkings on their home deck. They won the toss and exploded out of the blocks. We were not at our best with the ball or in the field but fought really hard to keep them under what was looking like a score over 400 at one stage. Needing 295 to win we gave ourselves every chance

with Nic showing the competition how good he is by making a very well-made 63 opening the batting, with Conor and myself put on a 50-run partnership going into the tea break again leaving us with a sniff of a win. Some late power hitting from Golby saw our score creep up towards their total but unfortunately it proved to be too much as we lost our last wicket for 227.

I was so proud of our efforts as a 1st XI this year. So many challenges faced, both on and off field. To overcome these and actually get closer as a group is a real testament to the players and the club as a whole. This is the second year in a row where we have played finals and lost to the eventual Premiers. We are close and if we can stick together and improve once again, I have no doubt that we will be able to get our hands on the McIntosh Shield. It will take hard work and contributions from many but looking at the success of the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI and the youth coming through I am confident we have enough there to be able to do great things in 23/24.

I would like to thank my playing group this year. Every Saturday was an absolute joy and I am sure the success we did have was due to the fact we all get along so well and want to do well for each other. A huge thanks to Mitch Gale for his efforts as VC and for stepping up in my absence. We have an absolute star in the making and no doubt a future captain of this great club. I am looking forward to seeing his form continue and grow into next season.

The team success we had was awesome and that winning feeling never gets old. In saying that it doesn't happen without some standout performances and to our new opening bowler combination – Thank you. Some big, long spells and 51 wickets between Conor (24) and Tom (27) gives us a glimpse into the next decade of the BCC 1st XI attack. Tom was able to win the association bowling award which was extremely well deserved after the effort he put into training and match day – he leaves nothing in the tank. Luke

winning another Len Toogood Medal for the best player in the competition is just outstanding. Considering he started the year with back-to-back ducks and didn't really bowl until the second half of the season it shows the sort of character and player we are lucky to call our own at Blackburn.

To Judge, thank you for everything you do for us as a 1st XI and for the club. We would not be anywhere near the team we are without your love and support. Personally, I really appreciate our chats on all things cricket and life and am extremely thankful to have your ear.

To Jo and the committee - Thanks is probably not enough for all the work you do behind the scenes to get everyone on the park playing and looked after in any way we need. The club is in great hands and please don't think anything you do goes unnoticed. As a playing group we will continue to strive for the elusive flag as some icing on the cake for all that effort you put in.

Can't wait for season 23/24 – We are Blackburn!

### ***Captain's Report***

Throughout the year we had some outstanding performances both with bat and ball. From a batting perspective it was great for these players to demonstrate to the younger members of the team what a successful batting performance looks like. These large totals were built on multiple partnerships with several players batting for a significant amount of time and with an extremely high price placed on each wicket.

On the bowling side the most outstanding performance was in round 12 when we played Laburnum at Ballashannassy Reserve, our home ground. We lost the toss and had to bowl first and proceeded to have a truly exceptional performance. We bowled out Laburnum for 31 in 23 overs with the absolute star of the show of our young bowlers - Daniel Geason who bowled 12 overs with figures of 6 wickets for 13, who was ably supported by Harry Geilman who took 2 for 10 of 6 overs and young Harry Geason who bowled 5 overs, to claim one for six. It was a complete performance. We then put on 200 with McKenzie getting 86 and Darcy Rowland with an impressive 68 before having a go at outright to which we got close.

While we had some outstanding performances throughout the season we also had some disappointing losses and needed to win our last two rounds with a result also needing to go our way to finish fourth.

With several solid performances this in fact did happen and so finals bound we were. Throughout the year a new club to the association had dominated our grade, the Glen Waverley Cougars, who had four or five of the top batsman in the comp and for good measure three of the top bowlers. With this formidable challenge the team went into the semi-final with some well-laid plans developed at training, setting tactics on how we would get each batsman out. Winning the toss on gameday we bowled first and started exceptionally. With our strongest bowling line-up in for the year with Mandeep Singh Gill coming down from the Twos, we were able to apply enormous pressure. In the end we had the top side 9 for 97 before dismissing them for 131. The pick of the bowlers was Daniel Geason with 5 for 44 and Mandeep 4 for 48. Both delivering outstanding performances though all the bowlers bowled to plans, built pressure and there were some fantastic wickets. The best example was the Daniel Geason dismissal of their star number 3 bat who chose to leave a ball which pitched on fifth stump, cut back and knocked off peg out of the ground, resulting in a second ball duck!

Sadly, while it was a near perfect performance with the ball we ran into a red hot bowling effort from Glen Waverley's best bowler and he finished with 5 for 14 off 18 overs with only Ben Sandells offering resistance.

In summary, a good year with lots of outstanding performances and an enormous amount of positive learning for a (mostly) young side.

## Women's (Inaugural) Season: 2022-23 in Review

The Club inaugural women's program commenced for season 2022-2023 after many years building the junior girls program.

This season the club entered its first ever women's team in the Inner East Social women's cricket competition which is a modified rules pathway competition, bridging the gap towards the well-established RDCA women's competition and the more serious women's Premier cricket. The modified rules are in place to increase participation: some rules helped, such as team sizes of nine players, no lbw rule and an emphasis on social interaction between teams. The women were not a fan of the plastic ball which, being lighter than a cricket ball, was hard to bowl with and hard to hit as the ball flight was slower and often didn't go as far as expected when hit.

Over the season we had 15 women play with the majority from our junior program as well as a number of Mums. It was a successful season with the team finishing on top with 6 out of 7 wins and playing finals with both the semi- and grand finals going to the last ball.

Firstly, the semi-final, with the opposition hitting a boundary four to win, we thought we had lost; however, it turned out that the opposition had sent out their best batsman instead of the correct retired batter and, on appeal, Blackburn were awarded the win, proceeding through to the grand-final. Amazingly, this game also went down to the last ball and with Blackburn needing 7 off the last over to tie (and win) or 8 to win. Ultimately, we fell 2 runs short. A close game that could have gone either way, and while disappointing not to get the flag, it can't dampen the spirits of the team and the success of the program.

As I reflect on the year it was fantastic to say see so many women playing for Blackburn. The competition had its good and bad points including the limited number of games - 7 plus finals – and, as already mentioned, many of the girls struggling with the ball, particularly those who had played with a real cricket ball in the morning.

Our grand vision is to progress into a full season competition such as the RDCA C grade women's competition; however, it will be a challenge to ensure that we have enough players with at least 4-5 more players needing to be recruited to make this viable. The upside is playing a mix of 20 in front 40 over cricket matches, a real cricket ball and 18 rounds over the full season.

The club has some fantastic players in the women's program and it is a proud fact that we have a full pathway for our female cricketers at the great Blackburn Cricket Club.

Special mention to Adrian Fox for organising everything with the ECA and overseeing the program and Luke Gibson who assisted with umpiring and scoring at every match.

## ***Junior Section: 2022-23 in Review***

We started the Season again with disruption after disruption. As mentioned earlier, the weather gods played a significant part in determining when and where the Junior season would start. The Season turned out to be fantastic but took some hard work to get to where we ended up.

With still no permanent Junior Section Manager, myself, Steve Dick, and the Age Group Coordinators started planning and making a few changes as to which associations our Juniors played in and where the safest venues to train and play would be.

With the top ground out of action for the whole Season and the lower oval in a terrible state and housing our training nets, the decision was made to use Morton Park West as a training venue only, on weeknights. It was deemed too dangerous for Juniors to be playing matches while Juniors were also training in the nets. This then threw up the need for extra training venues which included Ballyshannessy Park and Koonung Reserve (Blackburn North's Ovals and Nets).

Due to the state of Morton Park's Lower Oval, it took some time before any Junior teams were able to play safely on it.

Ballyshannessy, although some distance from Morton Park, became the perfect venue for both Junior and Senior teams on Friday nights and Saturdays. Those two ovals were refurbished a few seasons ago and were the stand out ovals for the season. Without football being played there, the ovals were in perfect condition for cricket and due to their refurbishment, were both able to withstand the wet start to the season. The same could not be said for Ballyshannessy Pavilion, with it being flooded for about a month!

I would like to thank and acknowledge the time and effort that the Junior Committee put in each week to get the kids on the park - Steve Dick, Anthony Hoyer, Ben Stone, Amanda Geason, Luke Gibson, Briella Humphries-Crouch, Adrian Fox and the young group of girls who took on the job of coaching the Woolies Kids (and who have and still play cricket with BCC) being Bella, Katie, Abbey, Isabel and Alana.

Special thanks to Peter "Turk" Turnley, Ronan Johnson and Tom Shanley for coaching the Under 16's.

Congratulations to Noah De Leo (Alan Berry Junior Male Champion), Alyssa Rowe (Fox Gibson Junior Female Champion) and Ronan Johnson and Tom Shanley (Peter "Turk" Turnley Award) on a terrific season.

Thank you also to all the Team Managers and Coaches who put in hours of work ensuring that the teams and the season ran as smoothly as possible.

We are a great Club, and we love what we do for our kids and the wider community and hopefully next season we will have more hands making lighter work.

All this was wrapped into a Pre-season Cricket Program run-through in September by Bella Fox and Ella Giblett and assisted by Jo Fox.

Great numbers of around 20 females came to some of these combined Female Fun Sessions!

Exciting times at BCC as many of our Junior Girls could finally see a FEMALE CRICKET PATHWAY at Blackburn.

And for the first time we appointed a Head of Female Cricket to oversee Junior Girls and Womens Cricket. Briella Humphreys-Crouch came to the fore and initiated great ideas, putting her shoulder to the wheel coordinating training sessions on top of her busy schedule with School and her Premier Cricket.

After 7 years of progression, our Girls would be involved in healthy numbers across Juniors Girls and Senior Women's cricket.

BCC offered Junior Girls cricketing opportunities in FIVE Main areas:

Age and Development Areas:

An observation of fabulous progression and transition between the Stages allowing further skills development for many girls. This underlined our efforts in planning to make sure the girls/teams are in the right competition grades/division.
